

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Eligibility and Requirements

Section I of Solicitation

Eligibility and Requirements

- Who qualifies as a "small business concern" (SBC) for an SBIR Phase I & II? <u>SBIR STTR</u> <u>Eligibility Guide</u>
 - Organized as for-profit U.S. business.
 - 500 or fewer employees including affiliates.
 - Greater than 50% U.S. owned by individuals and independently operated (with few exceptions).
- See 13 CFR § 121.702 for SBA's definition for the term "small business concern."



Eligibility and Requirements (cont.)


For Phase I, a minimum of <u>two-thirds</u> of the research or analytical effort, measured in total contract dollars (67%), must be performed by the awardee.

For Phase II, a minimum of <u>one-half</u> of the research or analytical effort, measured in total contract dollars (50%), must be performed by the awardee.





Eligibility and Requirements (cont.)



 More than one-half of the principal investigator's employment time is spent working for the small business. This precludes full-time employment with another organization.



The R/R&D work must be performed in the United States (with few exceptions and only if written approval in advance) for Phase I, II, and IIB.




Eligibility and Requirements (cont.)

U.S. DOT elects at this time <u>not to use the</u> <u>authority</u> that would allow firms that are majority-owned by multiple venture capital operating companies (VCOCs), hedge funds, or private equity firms to participate in the SBIR Program. Offers submitted by these parties will not be evaluated or considered for award.

This does NOT include allowable VCOCs per 13 CFR 121.702(a)(1)(i) that are majority-owned by a single VCOC, hedge fund, or private equity firm that is itself a small business concern.



Phase I Offer Submission Process DO's and DON'T's

DO...

 Read the Solicitation and follow <u>all</u> the instructions for submission.



- Review the research topic Q&A from the pre-solicitation forum.
- Check to ensure completed appendices are included.
- Double check all cost figures and calculations; align to supporting documentation.
- □ Sign and date Appendix A.
- Submit your Disclosure Form.

DO NOT ...

- Send offers via email.
- □ Submit duplicate offers.



- Ask the Program Office for guidance on whether or not your company should submit an offer.
- Create arbitrary overhead, indirect, or profit/fee rates.
- Wait until the deadline to submit your offer.



Technical Section

See Section II(B)(6) for detailed instructions!

- Ensure that:
- Layout guidance and section organization instructions are followed.
- The offer aligns with the scope of the research topic.
- Qualifications for key personnel in addition to the PI are provided.
- A detailed and well-organized work plan is provided.



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Required Registrations

- Register in System for Award Management (SAM) <u>https://www.sam.gov/portal/SAM/</u>. SAM is where businesses are assigned a Unique Entity Identification (UEI) Number
 - <u>Start this early</u> registration in SAM needs to be completed prior to proposal submission and can take time.
- Register for a Small Business Administration Small Business Concern ID Number (SBA SBC ID) <u>https://app.www.sbir.gov/company-</u> registration/overview
 - <u>Review</u> Make sure the information is accurate and has been updated in the past 6 months.

Appendix C - Pricing Information

Carefully read the SBIR Phase I Pricing Instructions within Appendix C (Contract Pricing Worksheet).



- Provide supporting information for all costs proposed so that the Government may award your contract promptly.
- Any cost that is not supported may cause the offer amount to be reduced.



Appendix C - Price Information

Schedule	Appendix C - Element	Guidance
A	Indirect Costs	Provide DCAA Indirect Rate Agreements to support indirect rates proposed. If not available, provide detailed cost elements of indirect rates to support rate(s) proposed.
B	Direct Labor	Provide supporting documentation such as payroll data, online comparisons, Dept. of Labor reference information, etc.
C - E	Materials/Equipment/ Special Test Equipment/Special Tooling	Provide quotes, internet pricing sheets, or other backup to support proposed unit pricing.

Schedule	Appendix C - Element	Guidance
F&G	Subcontracts & Consultants	Offeror must provide complete cost details for subcontract amount, e.g., quote from proposed subcontractor; include a letter of commitment for any proposed consultant.
H	Travel	Travel is allowable, however unusual for Phase I projects. If proposed, clearly define travel details and proposed costs.

Evaluation Factors, Award Information, and Submission of Offers

Sections III, IV, and V of Solicitation

Evaluation Criteria for Phase I

1. Technical Merit and Feasibility

Demonstration of understanding of the problem and solution alignment with the topic description; innovative approach; scientific feasibility.

2. Experience, Qualifications, and Facilities

Description of technical personnel, equipment and facilities, and partnerships/subcontracts (when applicable).

3. Effectiveness of Proposed Work Plan

Clarity of technical plan and timeline.

4. Commercial Potential

Market understanding and awareness of regulatory, compliance, or legal issues.

5. Offer Quality

Quality of narrative and supporting evidence.

Evaluation Process for Phase I Initial Evaluation

All offers will be screened to determine responsiveness to the solicitation instructions.

Responsive offers will be evaluated by topic experts. The most favorably rated offerors may be invited to attend Pitch Day and/or recommended for award.

Pitch Day Information

- Pitch Day will be a virtual event on or around May 5-9, 2025.
- If invited, the session will be 45-minutes, including:



- 15 minutes (timed) to present pitch decks.
- 15 minutes (timed) for evaluators to ask questions.



Pitch Day: Evaluation Criteria & Requirements

- Same evaluation factors as initial offer.
- See Solicitation Section II(B)(7) for detailed instructions.
- Invitation only and separate from the initial submission.
- Invited offerors must submit a pitch deck in MS PowerPoint or PDF.
- There is neither a set format for the slides nor required content.
- Slides will only be accepted from offerors invited to Pitch Day by the Government.

All Phase I awards will be Firm-Fixed-Price

- I he period of performance for a Phase I award shall be no longer than <u>6 months.</u>
- Under Phase I SBIR awards, <u>three reports</u> will be required, consisting of two interim narrative reports and a comprehensive final report.
- Payments for Phase I efforts will be made in <u>three equal</u> <u>installments</u> for report deliverables upon submission of an acceptable report and invoice, in accordance with instructions in the award document.




Submitting an Offer

Offers must be received no later than **3:00 p.m. ET on Friday, March 7, 2025,** through U.S. DOT's automated system:

- Offers received after that time will be automatically rejected; <u>no</u> <u>exceptions</u> will be permitted.
- □ Requires answering several questions and is a multi-step process.
- □ Allow ample time to complete the process.
- □ Offers will not be considered received until the process is complete.
- □ Submit offers as early as possible.
- □ Appendices can only be uploaded in correct format.



Topic Funding Considerations

- Offers that exceed the Phase I Estimated Award Amount stated in the Solicitation will not be considered for award.
- The Phase II funding level noted is an estimate only and is subject to the availability of funds and/or the technical requirements to accelerate the development of a commercial product/innovation. Any changes to the Phase II estimated funding level listed will be communicated to small business Phase I awardees when instructions on the Phase II process are sent, approximately 1 month prior to the end of the Phase I project.

Important Reminders

- **Review the offer before submission to ensure:**
 - Documents requiring signatures are signed and dated.
 - The research and analytical effort and the PI's employment status meet eligibility requirements.
 - Supporting documentation for prices proposed is included.
- Allow sufficient time to submit an offer; the submittal process may take several minutes to complete due to a multi-step process.
- Double check that documents submitted are the correct/final versions.
- Complete the registration for SAM and SBA SBC ID prior to the submission of your proposal.

SBIR Fraud, Waste, and Abuse Overview Department of Transportation, Office of Inspector General



- Fraud is described as any false representation about a **material fact or any intentional deception** designed to deprive the United States unlawfully of something of value or to secure from the United States a benefit, privilege, allowance, or consideration to which an individual or business is not entitled."
- OIG does <u>not</u> prosecute innocent mistakes. Although the statute requires knowledge that the claim was false, the term "knowledge" includes "deliberate ignorance" or "reckless disregard for the truth."
- Fraud can be committed by government contractors and subcontractors, as well as by agency personnel.



- Within the SBIR program, there are several points during the process where fraud can occur. They include, but are not limited to:
 - During the application process;
 - Within the proposal itself;
 - Award period of performance; and
 - Close-out



Four Main Types of Fraud

It is important to note that the presence of one or more indicators does not prove fraud, nor are the indicators shown all-inclusive for each of the schemes described.

- Misrepresentations or factual omissions
- Misrepresentation of expended funds
- Misuse of award funds
- Duplication of funds



Which SBIR rules should you be particularly familiar with?

- Duplicate or overlapping proposals may not be submitted to multiple agencies without full disclosure to all agencies.
- Company must meet the Small Business Administration's requirements for a small businesses, including being majority American-owned and have **500 employees or less.**
- The PI's **primary employment** must be with the company during the contract period. **The PI may not be employed full-time elsewhere.**
- Research and development must be performed in the United States.
